Stats

Since the start of the year, Chesterfield Foodbank has provided food to 3727 people, 2829 Adults and 898 children. Thanks to each and everyone who has supported us to make this possible including our teams of dedicated volunteers, our donors, partners, referral agencies and supporters.

Latest reports

Our Financial Inclusion program with
Chesterfield Citizens Advice has highlighted
some valuable information about clients
accessing the service via Chesterfield Foodbank.
Not only does it help us to understand the stark
reality of the issues people in our community are facing, but also we can
be sure that access to this precious service is having a positive impact for

those who are able to engage.

6 out of 10 people this quarter have needed to access emergency cash as well as a food parcel. Some reasons for this include failed equipment or appliances, benefit deductions, or no rights to sick pay. The people accessing CA via our foodbank have 10 complex issues on average per person, double the average for a non-foodbank user. There has been an increase in the proportion of people aged 25-29 accessing the service, and an increase in the number of people with long term health conditions and disabilities. 24% of people have children, 43% have long term health conditions or disabilities. The most prevalent issues include Benefits and Tax Credits, Universal Credit, Charitable Support and Debt.

Since our Financial Inclusion programme began in Summer 2022, which saw a trained advisor assigned to each day-time foodbank centre across Chesterfield, CA have supported our clients with benefit applications, and helped them to challenge unfair benefit decisions. They have made referrals to other services including housing and fuel vouchers. Thanks to the FI programme and CA service, our clients have received £219K of financial gains, been helped to manage £181K of debt and had £83K of debt written off. An estimated 1 in 4 people engaging with this service no longer needs to rely on the foodbank and emergency food parcels. A massive thank you to Citizens Advice and their wonderful advisors who support us and our clients daily at our foodbank centres, as we continue with our mission to end the need for foodbanks.
