Our New Warehouse

Over the past few months, we've successfully moved into our new warehouse, which is where we receive, sort and store the generous donations we receive from our community. We are still on Carrwood Road Industrial Estate, at Unit 6 now, opposite our old premises.

Although the new warehouse is more compact than our previous premises, it has quickly become our new home. Our volunteers have worked incredibly hard to organise the space, adapt to new ways of working and ensure there has been no disruption to the support we provide.

Behind every emergency food parcel is a huge amount of work. Every donated item is received, checked, sorted, stored and packed by our dedicated warehouse volunteers before it reaches someone facing hardship. We're extremely grateful

to every volunteer who helped make the move such a success.

In June, we welcomed volunteers to a special Warehouse Warming celebration to thank everyone who helped with the move and to officially celebrate our new home. It was wonderful to spend time together, reflect on everything that had been achieved and look ahead to the future.

We'd also like to say a huge thank you to Severn Trent for their generous support towards our warehouse costs. Quite simply, without a warehouse our work would not be possible. Their funding, together with the generosity of our wider community, helps ensure we can continue providing emergency food and support to local people when they need it most.

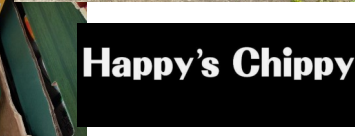
Sainsbury's and Morrisons

We're also incredibly grateful to **Lesley (and her helper, Harry)**, who held a car boot sale and donated proceeds of £40 to the foodbank.

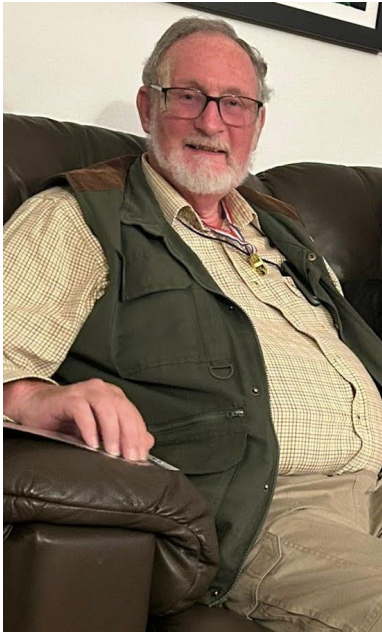
Every pound raised helps us continue supporting local people facing hardship. Thank you.

Volunteer Spotlights

After many years of dedicated service, 3 of our volunteers have hung up their foodbank lanyards for the last time. We asked each to reflect on their time volunteering with Chesterfield Foodbank.

Nigel—Tuesday Compass Team

What has been your favourite memory or moment from volunteering?

"My favourite part has been seeing just how much we're helping people. Taking the time to talk with guests makes such a difference. They're always grateful for the food they receive, but they also leave with a much more positive outlook because they know someone is there to help them. It's a real pleasure to see that change in people."

What have you enjoyed most about being part of the foodbank team?

"The teamwork has been wonderful. If someone is struggling or feeling overwhelmed, there's always somebody ready to step in and help. No one is ever left on their own. Working as part of such a supportive team has been a real pleasure, and it's that teamwork that helps us provide the best possible service for our guests."

What message would you like to leave for our volunteers and supporters?

"Volunteering at the foodbank is such a worthwhile thing to do. The pleasure you get from helping people who are struggling is a real blessing. I'd encourage more people to get involved because there are so many rewarding opportunities. I'm really sad to have to give up my volunteering duties due to my health, but I'll always be grateful for being part of such a fantastic team."

Rita—Hasland Team

What has been your favourite memory or moment from volunteering?

"The first time I walked in I felt very accepted. It's a very friendly group. They are very kind and caring. When clients came in and told their stories, they were very sad stories and the first time I heard them I couldn't believe it. It was breaking my heart. That was my first impression."

What have you enjoyed most about being part of the foodbank team?

"Giving my clients encouragement to see that they needed help, that they shouldn't be embarrassed to use the foodbank and helping them when they came in. When they came in, they were so downcast and embarrassed but it was marvellous to see that after being with us, they left with their heads held high and they valued themselves again. They left with self-respect."

What message would you like to leave for our volunteers and supporters?

"We don't realise how important our being in the Foodbank is for the people who use it. We give encouragement and help our colleagues. The human aspect of the Foodbank is very great."



Fiona—Tuesday Compass Team

What has been your favourite memory or moment from volunteering?

I have lots of happy memories from Foodbank but perhaps my best memories come from helping people who didn't realise that such help was available. One particular lady called in just because she didn't have anyone to talk to following the death of her husband. She had been his carer for many years and had no income, no job, no food and no hope. Also, she was having to leave her bungalow as it had been fitted for a disabled person. While not being able to solve all her problems we organised a foodbank voucher and she left with a bag of food, a smile on her face and with appropriate signposting to other agencies.

What have you enjoyed most about being part of the foodbank team?

When I left teaching I thought that I would miss the children the most. However, what I really missed was being useful and productive. I also missed the company of my colleagues. Coming to help at Foodbank gave me the opportunity to learn new skills, to do something different and to meet lots of new people. It has been an absolute pleasure to work with the fantastic team, particularly at Tuesday Compass and I am honoured to be able to call them friends.

What message would you like to leave for our volunteers and supporters?

Foodbank at Chesterfield can only exist through the kindness and generosity of people who donate food, energy and their time. All the volunteers

that I have come across have been very well trained and are friendly, knowledgeable and compassionate people who do a fantastic job in sometimes difficult circumstances. The support within the team and from Pat and Jacq is excellent. I would thoroughly recommend becoming a Foodbank Volunteer. You will make many friends, do something very fulfilling and be able to take part in a wide range of social activities as well.

Our heartfelt thanks to Nigel, Rita and Fiona for their many years of dedicated service to Chesterfield Foodbank. We are so grateful for everything they have given and the difference they have made to so many lives. We wish them every happiness for the future and hope they know they will always be part of the Chesterfield Foodbank family.
